This is a sure way to boost performance, nay excellence today so that tomorrow we will have many more professor Rose LEKEs, a daughter of the region, recipient of the coveted Virchow's price in Germany four days ago for her exploits in vaccinology and public health. May her example inspire the girl, the woman, and the vulnerable to work toward the promise of a greater destiny for humanity!

During this September 2023 session, we will revisit the mileage covered so far focusing on making our communities cleaner, safer, more secure and healthier.

There is no gainsaying that the key to the peace so sought after is education; more enrolment and improved quality especially in the professional, science and technology departments! Whereas more children are going to school this academic year, vigilance to rid schools of violence, drugs and arms is ever so pressing. Notwithstanding, the sporadic horrors and terror like the recent assassinations in Guzang, the voyage to peace is a steady no return journey. Let us rise for a minute of silence in memory of the departed victims of this asymmetric war! May the souls of the departed rest in peace as the living harvest peace and solace! We laud the increasing collaboration between the citizens and security forces that is yielding tangible results. As this growing partnership, secures our communities, an enabling environment is created for the activities within our Peace and Development Initiative. An update of community driven high intensity labour activities in our sub-divisions is on the menu of this session. The voices of the community are captured in the 5th edition of the North-Westerner magazine. steady The increase in employment, albeit temporary, re-establishment of village markets and local economies are non-negligible outcomes of the PDI. An interesting indicator of the changing tide is the number of beneficiaries (workers) who are compensated for community labour region-wide. This falls in line with government pro-poor policy for the poorest in our urban and rural communities. The PDI brings together all stakeholders, in a bid to count and count on everyone as in "U na Mi, Mi na U, Wi bi Wi"! We thank all actors in the Peace and Development Committees, for harmony, love and compassion will surely be our portion as we share lives evermore! Being one another's keeper and building trust is the recipe for sustained peace.

Another key indicator of progress on the road to peace is school attendance. This was addressed yesterday as well as progress on the economic front with the Customs clearing house, baby steps in the development of the Regional Eco-Industrial Park, of the North-West Development and Investment Fund which also presented.

It is in this regard that we promote the arts and craft industry, look around and savour the sturdy, beautifully crafted bamboo chairs, furniture by our youth. The ingenuity and proverbial industry of our communities will be unleashed with transfer of powers and competences in the arts, craft, culture, small and medium size industries! We are glad and comforted with the space created in the market place by the import substitution policy of the President of the Republic. With gentle persuasion to consume what we produce and a shift in mind set, we are certain to put the region on the rails to economic emancipation!

Mr Minister, the Representative of state, honourable ladies and gentlemen,

While it may be understandable that the region is going about its business as expected, and that the local/regional public service is expected soon, the embargo on recruiting staff compels it to rely on voluntary staff. This is a management risk as their statutory yearly turnover doesn't augur well for sustained outcomes. We are confident you can and will provide a solution to this aching human capital issue.

Once more, thank you for coming. The welcome with peace plants was more than a symbol, their male and female varieties depict union for; together we are stronger, together we are better and together we will go further. As the harbinger of good tidings, please relay to government and the father of the land, the President of the Republic, Head of State, His Excellency Paul BIYA that your brothers and sisters of the North-West are resilient in the hope of a better tomorrow under his stewardship.
