You have and continue to improve the lives of our women and families since you have been at the helm of MINPROFF. You are a true icon, a model for our youth and all those in search of peace and debelopment.

You come today to witness the joint session of the Regional Assembly, the people's bicameral institution made up of the 70 member House of Divisional Representatives and the 20 member House of Chiefs, a special status distinction of the North- West and South-West Regions. How happy we are to have our Representative of State and the Minister in charge of the welfare of women and our families in session with us, a never to forget event in the annals of our region.

During this September 2023 session, our twelveth, we revisit the mileage covered so far focusing on making our communities cleaner, safer, more secure and healthier. The multifaceted actions of the women empowerment and family centers are indispensinle in training, coaching, mentoring and developing our communities. Oh how happy are women are to develop thrift and loan savings institutions nurtured from these centers!

Whereas more children are going to school this academic year, vigilance to rid schools of violence, drugs and arms is ever so pressing. Notwithstanding, the sporadic horrors and terror like the recent assasinations in Guzang, the voyage to peace is a steady no return journey. Let us rise for a minute of silence in memory of the departed victims of this asymmetric war! May the souls of the departed rest in peace as the living harvest peace and solace!

We laud the increasing collaboration between the citizens and security forces that is yeilding tangible results. As this growing partnership, secures our communities, an enabling environment is created for the activities within our Peace and Development Initiative. An update of community driven high intensity labor activities in our sub-divisons is on the menu of this session. The voices of the community are captured in the 5th edition of the North-Westener magazine. The steady increase in employment, albeit temporary, re-establishment of village markets and local economies are non-negligible outcomes of the PDI. An interesting indicator of the changing tide is the number of beneficiaries especially women who are compensated for community labor region-wide.
