

NWRA: ANCHORING ON FEASIBILITY STUDIES FOR EFFECTIVE PROJECT REALIZATIONS


The growth and recognition of project maturation, execution and management has significantly changed over the years and these changes continue to increasingly expand. As far as the missions and objectives of the North-West Regional Assembly are concerned, with the crucial need for effective project realization, comes the indispensable role of thorough fea-

sibility studies before project implementation. Many people ignorantly ask why the North-West Regional Assembly spends huge costs on carrying out feasibility studies. This article is aimed at clarifying this misconception. Given that the North-West Regional Assembly is out to create real change and impact in our communities, it can be quite thrilling to start a complex large-scale project for signif-

icant benefit to the population, but of what use is such a project without carrying out a thorough analysis to determine the viability and feasibility of such an initiative to the benefit of our people? Carrying out prior thorough feasibility studies and community need assessments before project implementation is as good as the project itself.

What is actually a feasibility study?

Before every worthwhile realization, project Regional Assembly ries out a feasibility study or comprehensive analysis that assesses or evaluates the proposed project's practicality and viability to determine how feasible the project is. The Regional Assembly through these feasibility studies conducts the rational analysis of every proposed or potential project to determine its weaknesses, strengths, potential opportunities and



threats, resources or cost required to realize the project and the expected value or ultimate success prospects of the project envisaged.

The key elements of feasibility studies include an architectural report, topographical report, geotechnical report, financial report (bill of quantities and cost estimate), structural calculation report and a business plan where necessary.

What is actually the main objective or primary purpose of a feasibility study?

The Regional Assembly fully understands that it takes a good and well-conceived feasibility study or analysis to determine the viability of every proposed project. These studies aim to provide an independent assessment that fully examines all aspects of every proposed project, including technical, economic, financial, legal and environmental considerations and more that ensure healthy decision-making to determine if the given project is feasible, justifiable and worth investing in for the benefit

of the population and communities.

Without these prior analyses, it is impossible to determine whether or not a proposed project is worth pursuing; and most often, the study results can also be used to create a realistic project plan and cost, if the project is validated to be implemented.

How many feasibility studies has the Regional Assembly conducted so far as at its midterm mandate (30 months of existence)?

In practical terms, the Regional Assembly carried out a total of eleven (11) feasibility studies in 2021 and 2022 budgetary years and these studies formed the basis for all on-going and executed projects of the North-West Regional Assembly. Through quality feasibility studies, the North-West Regional Assembly has been able to secure funding from FEICOM to the tune of seven billion, five hundred million (7,500,000,000) CFA.

NWRA: MAKING SIGNIFICANT STRIDES IN RE-CONSTRUCTING THE REGION

It is crucial to first and foremost understand the program areas of the North-West Regional Assembly, because they constitute the basis on which every project activity or action is realized. As a matter of fact, competences have been devolved by six ministerial departments through which their activities run on four programs which are: Program 1: Improving the Provision of Basic Social Services, Program 2: Promotion of Economic Development and Environmental Protection of the Region, Program 3: Promotion of Citizenship, Culture, Sports and Youth Support and Program 4: Governance and Local Administration.

As at Mid-Term mandate, the North-West Regional Assembly has programmed a total of sixty six projects with 11 being feasibility studies, 16 new constructions, 24 rehabilitations, three Controls, five Supply projects and seven for other works; giving a total of sixty six projects as mentioned above.

Following the recommendations of the acceptance committee; the contractor, the Jobbing order Engineer and I, the Beneficiary, we did sit down and agreed that, the lines on the bill of quantities which were not executed, should be removed, and the funds used to rehabilitate the roof.

The foreman came to the hospital on the 8th of February 2023 and did some assessments and left without us arriving a consensus on the items to be removed from the bill of quantities. It was on the 21st of February 2023 that we concluded on the readjustment of the bill of quantities, in the presence of the Honorable councillors for Ako and the Director of general affairs at the Regional council.

The Jobbing order engineer promised to deposit the new draft project the next day, 22nd February 2023

in the morning, and the contractor promised to resume work immediately. As I write the work on the roof of the male and female work is being rounded off (95% completed since

the funds could not permit work on the entire hospital roof). I will like to end by expressing gratitude of the staff and patients for this work done by the Regional

council.

Assembly's PDI mission was preceded by capacity training seminars to drill the stakeholders and beneficiaries on the modalities of the project in all the 07 Divisions of the Region. It should be noted that the Peace and Development Initiative of the North-West Regional Assembly has as vision to build peace and drive socio-economic development through community driven decentralized activities, a way to rebranding a new North-West Region. Moreso, to promote solidarity, social cohesion, citizen-participation and improved livelihoods, which are the pillarstones for the construction of the new North-West Region where in everyone counts and is counted and we grow together as one united fabric as our proverbial slogan clearly states; "U na Mi, Mi na U, Wi bi Wi". 





