Youth Empowerment and Employment (YEE) indeed should be the fountain of our endeavors in the rebirth of our region, as in the fountain of youth! No business or community can thrive let alone survive without investing in its future. The development focus of the Executive Council through the three commissioners for Health and social affairs; Education, Culture, Youth and

Sports; and finally Economic Development speak to the legislator's preoccupation. History shall appraise how this maiden Regional Assembly takes ownership of the National concern that has rightly been transferred to the REGION. We yearned to manage our affairs, the challenge is here and now. The ten-region race is on. Where do we want to be in this race of the regions? We can and should be the best! But to forge on we must agree on the collective will to build peace, a North West community Peace Pact (NWCPP)!

Finally- the North West community Peace Pact (NWCPP); My dear people if we can dream of a Bamenda dry port, what forestalls the dream of the North West, an ocean of peace?

It is a matter of survival. We must stop the collective fratricide, it is the one action that will determine, indeed condition our survival as a people!
